Conditions of employment

Posts will be supervised by a member of the SCEPTRe team who will provide guidance and feedback on the work as it develops. They will have the use of 'hot-desk' space in SCEPTRe offices, with the use of a networked computer and Skype video-conferencing facilities. Other SCEPTRe equipment can be borrowed and SCEPTRe learning spaces can be reserved, as required.

Payment: Up to 100 hours @ £7.50 per hour. Payment will be made via Blue Arrow.

enthusiastic and curious about how you – and others – learn;

used to influencing/negotiating through writing, speaking, etc.;

enjoy accomplishing tasks by working in teams and on projects;

able to organise study and personal life so as to devote a minimum of 5 hours a week (during the first two semesters) to SCEPTRe projects and activities.
